CMHR Montage Film Video Blog Project

For this project, you will need to use a mobile video editor app on your smartphone. One person in each group should be your camera operator and editor. You will be given a series of tasks to complete which will all be combined together to make a blog documentary-style montage film.

Task 1

In your groups ask the question: "What do we know about human rights?"

Record someone saying the question in your video app, then record everyone saying their responses.

Task 2

In your groups ask the question: "What do we want to know about human rights?" and "What are some questions that we have about human rights?". Make a list of these on chart paper.

Record a video pan of your questions. Have someone from your group read them as you pan. Ensure that their voice is loud and clear. Reshoot the shot if needed.

Task 3

While at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights, visit these galleries and record the following shots:

- What Are Human Rights?
 - Take a slow pan of the gallery and record your understanding of what human rights are. Write down what your understanding is here:

- Indigenous Perspectives
 - Shoot a tracking or movement shot as you walk into the gallery. Record anything that you learn in this gallery about Indigenous rights. Write down what you learn here

- Canadian Journeys

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- Shoot a landscape perspective of the gallery.
 - Choose one station in the gallery. Record a shot of this gallery and explain what is in it and why it is historically significant.
- Examining the Holocaust
 - Walk around this gallery and consider the fragility of human rights. Explain in a video clip
 - "What was the holocaust?",
 - "What could have caused this event to happen?",
 - "How has the world been affected by the holocaust now that it's over?"
 - "What is genocide?".

Visit the other galleries. Explore them and shoot some short video clips of things that are visually interesting. Experiment with different camera placements and perspectives.

After you have visited all of the galleries it is time to revisit your questions as to what you want to know more about and also consider what you have learned from these exhibits.
